

LISTS

PROGRAMMING LANGUAGES USE LISTS TO STORE GROUPED INFORMATION TOGETHER. THE INFORMATION IN A LIST CAN BE USED ALL AT ONCE OR JUST THE PARTS THAT ARE REQUIRED.

EXAMPLE

```
marvel = ["spiderman", "Venom", "Wolverine", "Captain A", "Hulk", "Cyclops"]
```

```
capcom = ["Ryu", "Zangief", "Megaman", "Chun-Li", "Morrigan"]
```



YOU CAN PRINT A WHOLE LIST OUT BY TYPING THE CODE LIKE:
`{ print(marvel) }`

IN PROGRAMMING LANGUAGES, THE FIRST NUMBER IN A LIST IS USUALLY 0.

YOU CAN PRINT OUT JUST PART OF A LIST LIKE:

YOU CAN ALSO PRINT OUT PART OF A LIST LIKE SO:

```
print(capcom[0] + " Vs " + marvel[1])
```
